About the Design Build Institute of America

The Design-Build Institute of America (DBIA) was founded in 1993 to provide a voice for design-build practitioners, to advocate best practices, to create and disseminate educational information, and to furnish advice and support to facility owners and users. Its membership includes design-builders, construction contractors, design professionals, subcontractors, representatives of government agencies, academics and other professionals.

Who Uses Design Build?

Design-Build is the project delivery system of choice on more than 50 percent of the non-residential construction projects in the European Community and more than 70 percent in Japan. In the United States, the private sector's use of design-build has been increasing during the past thirty years, and is found in a wide array of commercial, institutional and industrial applications. In the U.S. sector, the federal government, as well as many states and local governments, employ design-build contracting for a significant percentage of their building programs.

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The Mt. Diablo Club

In 1914, about the time Archduke Ferdinand of Austria was assassinated – the prelude to World War 1 – Robert Burgess converted the farm into Mt. Diablo Country Club as an incentive for people to buy lots of summer homes. He built the Chalet in 1916 as a 39-room inn for members and their quests. An overhead passageway connected the Chalet to the Clubhouse which is now a private residence at 1925 Alameda Diablo. Up the hill, where our present Clubhouse now stands, was pool hall. It also served as a gambling casino, Movie Theater and dressing rooms for the swimming pool. The pool dates from the Roaring '20s, when it as called "The Plunge". A new, larger state of the art pool opened in May 2002.

Diablo Lake

It's a man-made lake, one-and-a-half miles long, situated at the end of Alameda Diablo. It featured a boat dock, boathouse, canoes, rowboats, high and low diving platforms, outdoor lighting and a snack shack.

Diablo Barn

The Club's other main activity centered at the Diablo Barn at the corner of Aveneda Nueva and La Cadena. Here, the Club maintained a string of horses and a Riding Master. Horse shows, gymkhanas, and mountain riding were popular with children and adults.
