Dave Umstot, PE- Vice Chancellor, Facilities Management, San Diego Community College District



Mr. Umstot, oversees a \$1.555 billion construction bond program, facilities services, and police functions for the District. Prior to SDCCD, he worked for the San Diego Unified School District as the Executive Director of Facilities, responsible for implementation of its \$1.51 billion Proposition MM capital construction bond program and management of its \$131 million annual physical plant operations. Prior to educational facilities management, David had extensive experience in commercial and public agency construction most recently as V. P. of Operations for Syska Hennessy Group Construction. He earned a B.S. degree from the University of the Pacific and a Master of Engineering from Colorado School of Mines. He currently serves on the boards of the California Community College Facility Coalition (CCFC), DBIA Western Pacific Region, and the Core Group for the Lean Construction Institute San Diego Community of Practice. He is also Vice President-elect of PCAPPA.

Jose Nuñez, LEED AP - Vice Chancellor, Facilities Planning, Maintenance & Operations San Mateo Community College District



Mr. Nuñez is with the San Mateo County Community College District, which is comprised of Skyline College (San Bruno), College of San Mateo (San Mateo), Cañada College (Redwood City) and the central administration building in San Mateo. Mr. Nuñez is responsible to the Board of Trustees for the leadership, strategic planning and organizational development of all facilities maintenance and operations, capital construction, as well as Public Safety throughout the District. He also provides overall policy development and oversight to the District's \$896 million Capital Improvement Program. Mr. Nuñez has a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Chaminade University of Honolulu, HI, Master of Arts in Latin American Studies from the University of Texas, and a Master of Science in International Relations from Troy State University, Alabama. Mr. Nuñez is also a graduate of the United States Army Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He is also a LEED Accredited Professional. José served 23 years with the U.S. Army. During his career in the military, "Major" Nuñez served in a myriad of Foreign Policy, State Department, United Nations and humanitarian operations assignments around the world.
