Mr. Waltman is responsible for the design and construction of all new county and county redevelopment agency facilities and renovations to existing county facilities. In addition, Mr. Waltman manages a staff of 65 which includes plan check, permitting, inspections, project managers, environmental compliance, RDA and administration. The unit has over 100 active projects at any time ranging from very small renovations to projects in excess of \$50,000,000.

In 2009 the Economic Development Agency and the Department of Facilities Management merged to become one of the County of Riverside's largest agencies, with over 1000 employees and an annual budget of just over \$1 billion. This agency is known as the "Can Do Agency."
